ABOUT THE AMERICAN COWBOY




THE LEARN

AFTER THE AMERICAN CIVIL WAR [1865 to early 20th century] they came from the east to work on ranches and drive the trail. A **cowboy** is an animal herder who tends cattle on ranches in North America on horseback, and performs a multitude of other ranch-related tasks. The cowboy was the glue that held the West together. Ranchers would hire cowboys to keep a watchful eye

over the herds on the wide open range.

The usual Wild West cowboy gear consisted of a bridle, saddle, rawhide lariat, spurs, boots, chaps, hat, tarp, slicker, buffalo robe, blankets and most important... a Colt .45, "The Peacemaker." An old saying claims "Abe Lincoln freed all men, but the Colt .45 made them equal."





- Bit, bridle, and reins...the steering wheel and brakes of riding a horse
- Saddle...the bucket seat
- Rawhide lariat...lasso...rope to throw over a cow to lead it. Cowboy tow chain
- Spurs..The gas pedal to make the horse move ahead
- Boots...cowboy style boots
- Chaps...a leather shield worn over the jeans to protect the jeans and the legs
- Hat...the cowboy's umbrella from sun and rain, and sometimes his drinking cup
- Tarp...buffalo hide to sleep on, or use as a tent in bad weather
- Slicker...raincoat made from oil treated cloth
- Buffalo robe or blankets...cowboy sleeping bag
- Colt .45...the hand held gun that could shoot six bullets

Every item of the cowhand's clothing was designed for a practical purpose. The long-sleeved cotton or wool shirts rarely had pockets, so vests were usually worn to carry small items and provide added protection. Chaps worn over boots and pants provided a shield against the harsh brush of the rough country. High leather boots protected the cowboys' feet and ankles. The boots' pointed toes made it easier for the cowboys to slip their feet into their stirrups, and the boots' high heels helped to anchor the riders' feet and prevent them from slipping out.





Kerchiefs were more than decoration. They protected the back of a cowboy's neck from the sun, filtered out dust when worn as a mask, kept his ears warm in cold weather, and, if tied over the hat, kept the wind from carrying it off. In an emergency, kerchiefs also served as temporary hobbles for horses, horse blindfolds, bandages, signal flags, towels, and protection from those hot pans and coffee pots coming off the camp fire.

Hats. The shape of the cowboy hat is from the Mexican sombrero. The broad rim helped keep the sun and rain off the cowhand's face. Cowboys used their hats to dip water out of streams for themselves or their horses to drink, to fan fires, and as pillows. To hold up under these uses, a hat had to be made of fur or beaver felt.


The typical American Cowboy was often lonely, lived in harsh conditions, frequently exposed to danger, but always kept their humor and joked about everything. They didn't make much money

and enjoyed the simple way of life. They were reserved around strangers, did not tolerate meanness, cowardice, dishonesty, chronic complaining, or mistreatment of women who were scarce [few] on the wild frontier. Tough as nails, but generous and hospitable, these were the true Wild West American Cowboys.
