

THE WOMAN WHO CHANGED A NATION

Rosa Parks was an African American civil rights activist. The United States Congress called her the Mother of the Modern Civil Rights Movement

Parks was born on February 4, 1913, in Tuskegee, Alabama.

She is famous for not giving up her seat on a bus to a white man.

Quote from Montgomery Police Department Report: "We received a call upon the arrival the bus operator said he had a colored female sitting in the white section of the bus, and would not move back. We (Day & Nixon) also saw her."

Parks's action led to the Montgomery Bus Boycott, which lasted for over a year. During the Montgomery Bus Boycott, African Americans refused to ride the city buses. This caused the bus system to lose money.

In the end, the Supreme Court ruled that Alabama and Montgomery's bus segregation laws were unconstitutional.

Rosa Parks and her husband Raymond were members of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People [NAACP]. Rosa was a secretary and a youth leader in the organization.



Congressman John Conyers of Michigan employed Mrs. Parks from 1965 to 1988.

In February, 1987, she co-founded the Rosa and Raymond Parks Institute for Self Development.

Rosa Parks died on October 25, 2005. She was the first woman to lie in honor in the U.S. Capitol Rotunda.

Her response to being called "the Mother of the Civil Rights Movement" is modest. "If people think of me in that way, I just accept the honor and appreciate it," she says. In her autobiographical book "Quiet Strength," however, Parks is careful to explain that she did not change things alone. "Four decades later I am still uncomfortable with the credit given to me for starting the bus boycott. I would like [people] to know I was not the only person involved. I was just one of many who fought for freedom."



Biographer Douglas Brinkley Burkley wrote, "Faith in God was never the question for Rosa Parks; it was the answer. Parks' belief in God and her Christian religious principles were at the core of everything she did. It is the main theme in her book [Quiet Strength] and the message she hopes to impart: "I'd like for [readers] to know that I had a very spiritual background and that I believe in church and my faith and that has helped to give me the strength and courage to live as I did."

And the act that made her world-famous was uttering a single syllable -- No" -- when a bus driver named James F. Blake demanded that she, as a black woman, surrender her seat to a white man in Montgomery, Alabama in 1955. Her explanation was a declaration of human dignity: "I just wanted to be free like everybody else. I did not want to be continually humiliated over something I had no control over: the color of my skin."

The jeweller inquired, 'Would you like your girlfriend's name engraved on it?'


