Answer: The second sentence is the most correct. The second one is the way a native-English speaker would say it. The addition of "had" in the first sentence adds nothing of value.

FIREFIGHTING TERMS:

*"the whole nine yards" This means everything or all there can be.

* "lavished" Given in large amounts.

*"Charities" Organizations that help the ill, poor and others who have needs.

Accelerant: flammable fuel used by some arsonists to start or increase size of fire

Arson: the crime of setting fire to property

Backfiring: Intentionally setting fire to grass, brush or trees to control the original fire by creating burned over areas.

Drills: Training during which firefighters respond to a pretend fire as if it were a real emergency.

Evacuation: Removal of people, including firemen, from a dangerous area

Fire Break: Roads or paths cut through brush in hilly or mountainous areas. The purpose of these is to have an area with no brush, so that a fire will burn out rather than jumping to another area with brush.

Fire escape: Stairs attached to the side of a building to assist to help people escape.

Hotshot crew: A trained group of approximately twenty people which specializes in fighting forest fires

Pumper: A fire truck with a water tank.

Smokejumper: a firefighter that parachutes into a remote area to fight wildfires in forests and other nature areas.

Water drop: An airplane drops of water onto a fire from above.


